My role as a careers lead is to manage how careers is delivered across our school to all our learners. As a school we also work closely with our schools designated local authority Careers Advisor Joanna Cunliffe. Joanna's role within Kassia Academy is to ensure that all our year 11 learners have support and guidance when applying for further education.

At Kassia our aim is to provide every learner with the knowledge and skills needed for transitioning onto their next steps after leaving our school. We aim to strengthen and build our learners confidence, whilst equipping our learners with the skills they need to be successful once they leave school..

Each year, The Kassia Academy aims to provide experiences for all of our learners to interact with a range of local providers and businesses to hear about career opportunities. We do this by taking part in events, visits, assemblies, guest speakers and group discussions.

### KS3

This term, Our KS3 learners have been expanding their Skills around careers by attending Accent music and The Oarsome project. By attending these activities we believe our learners will gain skills they need for life; such as, team work, resilience and communication skills. KS3 Willows have also visited Chester Zoo to experience a day in the life of a zoo keeper whilst KS3 oaks visited the Police museum. These trips will give our learners more information around what career options are possible.

### KS4

This term, our KS4 learners have worked alongside For Housing, Head start, Team sport and Warrington Vale Royal College . Our year 11 learners have also been extremely busy planning their post 16 options. We have visited open days at local colleges and attended career fairs to interact with local employers. Joanna Cunliffe, our schools career advisor, has also met with all our year 11 learners to support them with CV's and applications for further education.
