A quick reminder: if a student is taking a book out on loan, they must use the library log to record it. This helps us keep track of our collection and ensures books can be enjoyed by everyone.

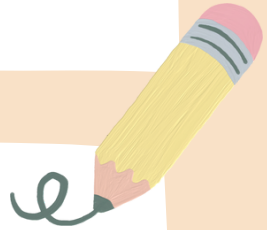


READING AT HOME- A PARTNERSHIP
